Recipe of the Month: Rainbow Couscous

Ingredients:

100g couscous (cooked)
1 tbsp chopped red peppers
1 tbsp chopped cucumber
1 tbsp sweetcorn
2 cherry tomatoes
2 dried apricots
6 grapes sliced in half
1 tsp chopped coriander
Cinnamon or paprika to flavour

Instructions:

Place some of the cooked couscous in the bottom of a small cup. If using dry couscous, place the dry couscous in the small cup and ask a grown up to pour over boiled water, then place it to one side for few minutes until you prepare the vegetables.
Using a knife chop the vegetables into tiny pieces
Spoon each type of chopped vegetable or fruit chopped over this so that you can see the layers
Add few sprinkles of chopped coriander
Optionally you could add some cinnamon powder and paprika for a bit of flavour

Baby Peppers

This month baby peppers theme of the month is under the sea. The children made their own fishes exploring different materials and textures. We used a variety of coloured paint and paint brushes to make different marks. The children practiced grasping hold onto the paint brush to create different marks and got very messy using their hands and fingers to. We have also been playing outside lots this month developing our physical development using the walkers to practice walking. The babies also have enjoyed exploring our sensory fish water mat showing high interest patting the water with their hands to move the fish inside. Baby peppers have also been practicing actions to nursery rhymes and moving our bodies to music. We have also been busy building tall towers with the stacking cups and knocking them down.

Tiny Peppers

We have had great month in Tiny Peppers!! We have had so much fun with our topics. Tiny Peppers especially loved 'Za Za Baby Brother' for our book of the week. We loved painting our hands and feet in the shape of Zebras. To add on to the book we did the topic of siblings. We had a fantastic baby washing tuff tray and enjoyed getting water everywhere. One of our rhymes is 'I can sing a rainbow'. We had lots of fun using different sensory materials to make our huge Rainbow for the display. We also painted our hands in the colour of the rainbow and Tiny Peppers loved it. We also loved joining in with the sign Language actions when singing the song. We have had a great month and looking forward to the next month of fun!!

Sweet Peppers

First of all, welcome back to everyone and to the new children who have moved up. In Sweet Peppers this month we have been having lots of water play fun with the bubbles. We have also enjoyed colouring in animals for our display and looking at the different sounds they made. Sweet Peppers have also enjoyed singing the song of the month at circle time which is old mcdonald. We have also looked at individual animal tuff trays. Our topic of the month has been sounds and we have been using different types of instruments to look at the different sounds they made. It has been lovely having everyone back to nursery. We have also been doing lots of music and movement to the tumble tots cd.

Chilli Peppers

This month Chilli Peppers have been looking at the topic of People who help us. We have had a new story book each week exploring different professionals such as doctors, police, and fire fighters. The children have explored the role play area and acted out their experiences at the doctors and dentists. We have also made our own professionals using diversity paper cut outs and different media materials. We have focussed on the letter A, the children have written the letter in sand, salt and flour using their fingers and sticks, as well as exploring the jolly phonics sound and movement during each circle time. In august we will be looking at the topic dinosaurs.

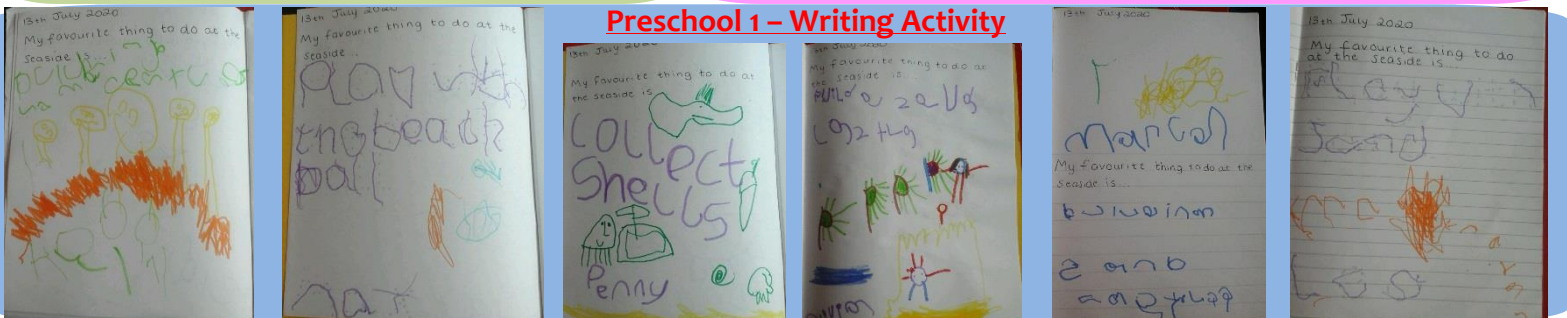
Grand Peppers (Preschool 1)

Policy of the month: Sun care Policy

At Pepperberry Day Nursery we are committed to ensuring that all children are fully protected from the dangers of too much sun/UV rays. Severe sunburn in childhood can lead to the development of malignant melanoma (the most dangerous type of skin cancer) in later life. We follow guidance from the weather and UV level reports and use the following procedures to keep children safe and healthy in the sun:

- Key persons will work with the parents of their key children to decide and agree on suitable precautions to protect children from burning, including those with more sensitive skin types and those that may be more tolerant to the sunshine, e.g. black and/or Asian colouring
- Children must have a clearly labelled sun hat which will be worn at all times whilst outside in sunny weather. This hat will preferably be of legionnaires design (i.e. with an extended back and side to shield children's neck and ears from the sun) to provide additional protection
- Children must have their own labelled high factor sun cream with prior written consent for staff to apply. This enables children to have sun cream suitable for their own individual needs. Staff must be aware of the expiry date and discard sunscreen after this date
- Parents are requested to supply light-weight cotton clothing for their children suitable for the sun, with long sleeves and long legs
- Children's safety and welfare in hot weather is the nursery's prime objective so staff will work closely with parents to ensure all appropriate cream and clothing is provided
- Staff will make day-to-day decisions about the length of time spent outside depending on the strength of the sun; children will not be allowed in the direct sunlight between 11.00am – 3.00pm on hot days
- Children will always have sun cream applied before going outside in the hot weather and at frequent intervals during the day
- Children are encouraged to drink cooled water more frequently throughout sunny or warm days and this will be accessible both indoors and out
- Children are made aware of the need for sun hats, sun cream and the need to drink more fluids during their time in the sun
- Shade will be provided to ensure children are able to still go out in hot weather, cool down or escape the sun should they wish or need to.

Vitamin D
Sunlight is important for the body to receive vitamin D. We need vitamin D to help the body absorb calcium and phosphate from our diet. These minerals are important for healthy bones, teeth and muscles.
