Welcome to the first newsletter of 2023. We have had a super busy month with lots of exciting activities whilst making the most of the snowy days too. After a lovely festive period, our little ones were happy to return to nursery in the New Year. I would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new families who have started with us in January. I am sure that you and your little ones will have a fabulous time here at Pepperberry with us.

Our charity donation for January was Bare Necessities. This is a local charity based on encouraging local people to donate toiletries and hygiene essentials to local businesses like ourselves. Once they are collected the items are distributed to local organisations and charities whose clients experience financial hardship or poverty. I would like to thank you all for your kind donations. These will help people in our local community.

Throughout the nursery we have celebrated 'Luna New Year', this is also called Chinese New Year. We celebrated with lots of Chinese food tasting and colourful activities. The children have been counting to three in Chinese, singing our 'Ni Hao' 'Wave and Say Hello' song, making a Chinese dragon using a frame and fabric, lanterns, lucky money wallets to name a few activities. What a super 2 weeks in nursery celebrating this exciting festival.

At the end of the month, Preschool 1 and Preschool 2 have had their first Preschool assemblies. Parents, carers, and Grandparents were invited into the nursery to listen to their little one's sing, they showed some of the work that they have been doing and some of the children were even confident enough to talk about their work when holding it up to show to the adults. To celebrate our parent/carer partnership we invited the families to stay and play in their little ones room. It is lovely to see the children engaging with different generations, sharing stories and play within their room.

For National Story Telling Week - It was lovely to see our Preschool children sharing books and stories with their family members during their stay and play. To extend story telling further, we have introduced some new story sacks into the rooms. These give the children props and objects relating to the story books and allow them to retell the story to their friends using the props, matching them to the pictures in the story and to talk about the story. Some of the rooms have been to trips to visit Wilmslow Library, to share stories, choose new books etc.

Each of the rooms have been on trips into the local community this month. They have been to Carrs Park to collect sticks to make 'stickman', linking this to their story of the week. Other rooms have been to the supermarket to buy fruit for fruit tasting activities, they have been to the library and more. The babies have been out in their prams for a walk around Wilmslow.

Our new Nursery Class for this year is 'Tunes for Tots' which is a fun music class, this takes place on a Tuesday afternoon. The lovely Beryl visits each of the rooms with her keyboard, musical instruments and props relating to the many different songs. The carefully planned programme of music and songs changes termly and are linked to seasons, festivals, colours, animals and much more. It is fantasticto welcome Beryl and her Tunes for Tots back into the nursery.

To extend our Parent/carer partnership further, we would like to continue to invite Grandparents and parents into the nursery to share and read stories to our little ones, particularly in Chilli Peppers and our Preschool rooms, where the children are more acceptable of their adults leaving following an activity. By doing so we are aiming to promote Intergenerational practice within our nursery where we bring people from different generations together in activities where people from all ages can learn together and from each other. We feel that it is an important part of lifelong learning. #### Recipe of the Month: Carrot cake

**Ingredients:** 

200g peeled carrots
175 soft brown sugar
200g self-raising flour
2 tsp cinnamon
zest of an orange
2 eggs
150ml sun flour oil
18cm square tin
gas mark 4 / 180C

- 1. Grate the carrots.
- 2. Add flour, sugar, cinnamon to carrots
  - 3. Mix ingredients all together.
- 4. Add beaten eggs ,Orange zest and oil and mix well.
  - 5. Add to baking tin and cook for 30 mins.

Decorate with cream cheese frosting.

#### Baby Peppers

This month baby peppers have been looking at the book colours. we enjoyed a different theme each week we concentrated on blue, we looked at different textures sensory objects around us that are blue we also created our own blue fish using potatoes to print the body's and glitter for the fins.

We looked at yellow and enjoyed decorating baby ducks and with this we sang the song 5 little ducks.

We also enjoyed celebrating Chinese New Year and burns night.

Keeping to the colour theme we enjoyed a trip to Sainsbury's where we picked out some exciting green vegetables and fruit to explore and taste. We included a juicy lime that's all enjoyed and some broccoli and peppers.

#### Tiny peppers

This month we have been learning all about Chinese New Year. Our Tiny Peppers have been creating artwork of traditional Chinese pieces, the children really enjoyed looking at the different colours involved such as red, orange, and yellow. We have also been looking at under the sea, using lots of different resources to create ocean creatures such as jelly fish and star fish. The children have really enjoyed making the sound of a fish, by smacking their lips together to create loud fish sounds.

This month we have reintroduced our care bear who will be going on some trips home with the children we ask that you send in the wonderful pictures to be put into our scrap book that the children will be able to look at in the room.

#### Sweet Peppers

This month in January sweet peppers have been looking at seasons and tractor in trouble. The children drew their own tractors using a variety of different colours. We even made sunshine's using tissue paper and glitter. Sweet peppers also made clouds using cotton wool and raindrops using blue paint. We then looked at different types of clothing that keep us warm for example hat, gloves, scarf and coats. Sweet peppers made bunny rabbits using brown paint and black paint.

We have enjoyed exploring Chinese New Year tuff trays, making Chinese lanterns and Chinese food tasting. The children loved tasting noodles, prawn crackers and rice. We even looked at Chinese writing.

#### Chilli Peppers

This month in Chilli peppers we have been learning about Winter and reading the book Polar bear's surprise. We made our own polar bears by looking at a real-life picture and then designing our own polar bear with paint. We made two big polar bears and decorated it with different materials such as pipe cleaners, tissue paper, sequins, paint, crayons, and glitter. We spoke about the clothing that we need to wear in winter to stay nice and warm. We added hats, scarfs, and gloves into our dress up and practiced putting our own coats on when going outside.

We have also celebrated Chinese New Year where we listened to short story about how some children in the world celebrate this festival. We then made our own Chinese lanterns using different coloured materials such as paint pens, tissue paper and glitter. We practiced make making by tracing over Chinese numbers and letters using different coloured felt tip pens.

Happy new year! To start January off we celebrated the new year by talking about things we would like to do our try this year for our new years resolution! We also painted numbers to make our 2023 calendars!
